Subject content:

- The development of Church, state and society in Britain 1509-1745
 - The English Reformation and Counter Reformation (Henry VIII to Mary I)
 - The Elizabethan religious settlement and conflict with Catholics (including Scotland, Spain and Ireland)

Session objectives:


In this session students will hear exciting stories of the Tower's dark Elizabethan history. They will question why were people were in trouble for being the 'wrong' religion; they will investigate the spaces used as Tudor prison cells. Was it possible to escape? You will be guided around the Tower to investigate the unique conditions in which Elizabethan religious prisoners lived and died.
