Applying history at the Tower of London (Applying history TOL)

New National Curriculum links at KS3:

Students will understand:

- The methods of historical enquiry, including how evidence is used rigorously to make historical claims, and discern how and why contrasting arguments and interpretations of the past have been constructed
- How people's lives have shaped this nation and how Britain has influenced and been influenced by the wider world

Subject content:

- The development of Church, state and society in Medieval Britain 1066-1509
- The development of Church, state and society in Britain 1509-1745

Session objectives:

This session will give students the skills to become a historian for the day. They will use primary sources including historic artefacts such as coins and archaeological material, as well as documentary sources, to analyse how we know about the past, and to question to what extend this evidence can be trusted.

What is History? supports the key processes of historical enquiry, in using evidence to make rigorous historic claims, and understanding how contrasting arguments and interpretations of the past have been constructed, using primary evidence to support or disprove these beliefs.


During your session:
