Fire! Fire! Teacher's notes

Length: 45 minutes

Meeting Point:

Please meet your session presenter outside the **Salt Tower**. Please arrive at least five minutes before your session is due to begin.

National Curriculum links:

- History: the lives of significant people.
- History: past events from the history of Britain.
- Citizenship: preparing to play an active role as citizens.
- English speaking and listening.

Session objectives:

It's 1666, and London is ablaze. The fire is spreading east, approaching the Tower's doorstep...and the fortress is filled with gunpowder! Pupils will meet with a costumed character that will describe these terrible events and tell the story of Samuel Pepys, who watched the flames from inside the ancient Tower walls.

During this session, pupils will:

- Look at buildings of the past (including some pre-fire houses within the Tower) and discuss how they are different from homes of today;
- Discuss the character and written accounts of Samuel Pepys;
- Develop their skills of empathy and communication through interacting with a presenter;
- Use their discoveries to draw comparisons between their own lives and the lives of people in the past.


During your session:
