Knights, castles and kings Teacher's notes

Length: 45 minutes.

Meeting Point:

Please meet your session presenter outside the **Salt Tower**. Please arrive at least five minutes before your session is due to begin.

National Curriculum links:

- History: the way of life of people in the past.
- History: the lives of significant people.
- Art and design: differences and similarities in the work of artists, craftspeople and designers in different times and cultures.
- English speaking and listening: to listen, understand and respond to others.

Session objectives:

Transport your pupils back in time to a world of knights, castles and kings. A costumed presenter will captivate you with true tales and myths from the Tower's colourful history whilst exploring one of the oldest castles in Britain. Stories can vary, depending on the age and interests of the group.

During this session, pupils will:

- Gain and understanding of chronology and learn how the site has changed over time;
- Learn about the Tower's use as a castle:
- Discover what life was like for a Medieval knight;
- Be enthused and inspired by stories and myths linked to the Tower.


During your session:
