Walter's War (First World War) - KS2 Teachers' notes

Length: 60 minutes

Meeting point on the day

Session description

It is 1916 and Walter Croft's friend and fellow member of the Royal Fusiliers explores the story of Walter's wartime experience, using storytelling and object handling.

This session was jointly created by The Tower of London and the Fusilier Museum, and asks pupils to consider the importance of remembrance.

Curriculum links

English (KS2) Spoken language

- Participate in discussions, presentations, performances, role play, improvisations
- Use spoken language to develop understanding through speculating, hypothesising, imagining and exploring ideas
- Articulate and justify answers, arguments and opinions

<u>History (KS2)</u>

 Study of an aspect or theme in British history that extends pupils' chronological knowledge beyond 1066

Learning outcomes

During this session, pupils will:

- Use objects to learn about the life of a soldier in 1916
- Use role play to discover more about a soldier's wartime experience
- Develop their skills of historical enquiry by questioning a costumed character

Preparation for your education session

In order to help your pupils enjoy this education session, we would request that, where possible, they are aware of the following concepts:

- a) Chronology; when the First World War took place and the impact of war on the people of London
- b) Different sources of evidence: ways in which we can find out more about life in the past.
- c) The concept of remembrance.
