Royal responsibility: for King or country? (Royal Responsibility)

Teacher's notes

Length: 50 minutes.

Meeting Point:

Please meet your session presenter outside the **Salt Tower**. Please arrive at least five minutes before your session is due to begin.

National Curriculum links:

- History: knowledge and understanding of events, people and changes in the past.
- History: Britain and the wider world in Tudor times;
- English speaking and listening

Session objectives:

It is early 1544 and there is a new queen at court: Henry VIII's sixth bride, Katheryn Parr. Pupils will visit sites around the Tower connected with Henry's previous wives. Accompanied by a courtier well-acquainted with the new queen, pupils will hear about the momentous lives (and deaths) or Henry's wives.

Through participating in this session pupils will:

- Increase their knowledge and understanding of the chronology of Henry's marriages;
- Increase their knowledge and understanding of the importance of marriage to the monarchy and nobility in the Tudor period;
- Increase their skills of enquiry by discovering the use of the Tower during Henry's reign;
- Increase their knowledge and understanding of the importance of the role of the court in Tudor times.


During your session:
