The King beneath the armour (King beneath armour)

Teacher's notes

Length: 60 minutes.

Meeting Point:

Please meet your session presenter at the entrance to the **Learning Centre**, which is situated around the **back of the Waterloo Block**. Please arrive at least five minutes before your session is due to begin.

National Curriculum links:

- History: knowledge and understanding of events, people and changes in the past.
- History: Britain and the wider world in Tudor times.
- Science: considering evidence and evaluating.
- Science: materials and their properties.

Session objectives:

This session accompanies the Royal Armouries impressive *Fit for a King* exhibition in the White Tower. It will examine one of England's most famous kings, none other than Henry VIII himself: King, sportsman and Tudor superstar. Pupils will have the opportunity to handle Henry VIII's replica armour and discover more about the man behind the metal.

During this session, pupils will:

- Develop their skills of analysis and interpretation using a range of original portraits and replica armour;
- Consider the validity of different types of historical sources and the relative values of different types of evidence when learning about Henry VIII;
- Increase their knowledge of what life was like for members of Henry VIII's court;
- Increase their knowledge and understanding of the use of the Tower of London during the Tudor period.


During your session:

Directions to the Learning Centre in the Waterloo Block:



- From the Bloody Tower walk up the steps straight ahead of you.
- Keep walking straight ahead Waterloo Block is in front of you.
- To access the Learning Centre you will need to go around the back of this building. Please do this using the path between the Fusiliers Museum and the Waterloo Block.
- Once around the back of the building you will come across a sign saying "No entry, except for booked school parties". Pass by this and the entrance to the Learning Centre will be on your left.
