Questioning the past through objects (Past objects)

Teacher's notes

Length: 60 minutes.

Meeting Point:

Please meet your session presenter at the entrance to the Learning Centre, which is situated around the back of the Waterloo Block. Please arrive at least five minutes before your session is due to begin.

National Curriculum links:

- History: Britain and the wider world in Tudor times.
- Historical enquiry: to ask and answer questions, and to select and record information relevant to the focus of the enquiry.
- English speaking and listening

Session objectives:

Your pupils will become history detectives, investigating replica objects with a member of the Tudor court. Examine the contents of a missing Tudor chest, and try to identify its owner using the objects as clues.

Through participating in this session pupils will:

- Develop their skills of analysis and interpretation using a wide range of replica artefacts from the Tudor period;
- Consider the validity of different types of historical sources;
- Increase their knowledge of what life was like for individuals, both rich and poor, during the Tudor period;
- Increase their knowledge and understanding of the use of the Tower of London during the Tudor period.


During your session:
