

Henry to Mary: a Religious Rollercoaster

Teacher notes

Duration: 60 minutes

Meeting Point: Clock Court

In the Tudor period, religion was a hotbed of revolution. The rollercoaster of religious changes led to widespread confusion and turmoil, impacting both the royal family and their subjects.

In this session students will explore primary evidence from the buildings of Hampton Court and analyse the impact of changes in the monarch's religion in one of the key locations where religious and political decisions were made.

Learning Objectives:

Students will:

- Analyse the impact the changing national religion would have on the Tudor court.
- Explore the physical evidence to examine the different kinds of religious belief among the early Tudor monarchs.

National Curriculum Links


This session supports:
