What was the Driving Force of the Reformation? (English Reformation) Teacher notes

Duration: 90 minutes

Meeting Point: Unicorn Statue/Clore Learning Centre

True believer or fickle opportunist? Can the buildings of Hampton Court offer insight into the choices and influences of Henry VIII?

In this session students will analyse Henry's own personal faith, the rollercoaster of shifting dogma and factions and the people who held different sway over the king's action.

Through study of both the physical evidence of Henry's palace and contemporary documentary sources, students will evaluate the factors that would set the course of England for centuries to come.


