## **Teacher Notes**

Duration: 1hr

Meeting Point: State Entrance

What stories do the different rooms in Hillsborough Castle tell? How should we behave in each of the different spaces? Become a house detective and find out!

Based partly in a classroom and partly in the rooms at Hillsborough Castle, this session will feature the following:

- Handling objects.
- A tour of the State Rooms at Hillsborough Castle.
- A call and response activity.
- Trying on elements of costume.
- Role-playing different scenarios & trying different actions.
- A sensory activity in the Dining Room, exploring food served at Hillsborough Castle.

# Learning objectives

#### Students will:

- Learn about some of the different uses of Hillsborough Castle throughout its history.
- Try out some of the different social behaviours linked to each room and its use.
- Make connections between historical events and real-life situations.
- Be empowered to use their senses to explore new historic environments.


