Duration: 45 minutes

Meeting Point: Tower of London: Salt Tower courtyard

Find out how to become a knight! Train at the Tower as a page, then a squire and finally earn your knighthood. Be transported back in time with true tales and marvellous myths from the Tower of London's colourful history.

In this session, a costumed presenter will use stories and role play to explore Tower's different uses and the lifestyles of the people who lived here.

Learning objectives

Children will:

- Learn about the Tower's use as a castle
- Compare and contrast life today with life in the medieval period
- Discover what life was like for a medieval knight

During your session


