

Tales from the Tower KS2

Teacher notes

Duration: 60 minutes

Meeting Point: Tower of London: Salt Tower courtyard

Be transported back in time with true tales and marvellous myths from the Tower of London's colourful history! How do the stories of the Tower help us build a picture of life in England over the centuries? And how do we know what really happened here?

Led by a costumed presenter, this sessions explores the Tower's role throughout history and encourages pupils to decide whether its stories are fact or fiction.

Learning objectives

Children will:

- Understand the Tower's role as a place of historic and national importance
- Be immersed in the stories of the Tower, in the locations where they happened
- Better understand how we know about events in the past and learn to question sources of evidence
