

A Prisoner's Tale: The adventures of Walter Raleigh KS1

Teacher notes

Duration: 45 minutes

Meeting Point: Tower of London: Learning Centre

Who is the mysterious Walter Raleigh and why is he a prisoner at the Tower? Uncover tales of adventure and exploration through object handling and role play.

In this session, children will meet a costumed presenter and hear tales of Sir Walter Raleigh, his expeditions and the surprising life he led as a Tower prisoner.

Learning objectives

Children will:

- Discover why Sir Walter Raleigh was an important character in our nation's history
- Investigate herbs and spices* to learn more about Tudor exploration and the types of exotica bought back from the New World






During your session
