Clue

1. My name is **John Dale**. I was Henry VIII's Master Cook. I worked in the kitchens here at Hampton Court for twenty five years!

Skip to the Tiltyard to see if you can discover more Lindt Gold bunnies!

Clues

2. I was a trumpeter for King Henry VIII and his father, Henry VII. My name is **John Blanke**.

3. I started building this Tudor palace for myself but then Henry VIII took it off me! My coat of arms can still be seen on the wall inside the palace in Clock Court. I am **Cardinal Thomas Wolsey**.

Venture into the Wilderness Garden to see which bunnies you can find there.

Clues

4. My name is **Catalina** and I was Katherine of Aragon's royal bedmaker. Can you find me near the Maze?

5. My plays were performed in the Great Hall here at the palace in front of kings and queens. You might have heard of me! I am **William Shakespeare**.

6. Bow to **Queen Victoria**! I opened Hampton Court Palace to the public in 1838.

There are more Lindt Gold bunnies hiding in the East Front Gardens, can you find them all?



Clues

7. **William Kent** at your service! I painted the Queen's Staircase with a beautiful mural for Queen Caroline and it can still be seen there today.

8. Playing tennis was a favourite hobby of mine so I had this indoor tennis court built in 1625. I am **King Charles I**. Do you know what happened to me?

9. I am **Queen Mary II**. I collected plants and had over 2,000 different types from all over the world.

10. I lived in here in 1930. My husband was a famous Antarctic explorer. My name is **Lady Emily Shackleton**.

11. Find me sitting by a tree painting my favourite views of the palace. I was born in Canada but came to London to study art. My name is **William George Storm**.

12. Queen Anne gave me a special key so that I could live here at the palace with her. I am **Sarah Churchill**.
