AT YOUR SERVICE

Historic Royal Palaces has a Sales Team to assist group organisers in planning visits to the palaces as well as advising coach and tour operators with itinerary and excursion planning.

Sales support

The Sales Team can help you with all your arrangements for your group's perfect day out including assistance with planning itineraries, information on our group ticketing options, dedicated group ticket offices and on-site catering. The sales team can also help you promote and sell your tours and excursions with content and images, which can be downloaded from hrp.org.uk/travel.trade.

Free admission

Free admission is given at all palaces to coach drivers and locally registered Blue Badge Guides. Groups that include members of Historic Royal Palaces will avail of the group price as long as there are 15 people in total. Full members of Association of Group Travel Organisers (AGTO) are eligible for free admission when bringing a group of at least 15 paying visitors.

Guiding in the palaces

Blue Badge and Accredited Guides can guide inside the Tower of London and Hampton Court Palace. No guiding is currently allowed inside Kensington Palace due to space restrictions however Blue Badge Guides are given free admission to escort their clients. Palace Explainers will be on hand to answer any questions your clients may have.

Easy to get to

For group visits, all palaces have coach parking or pick-up and drop-off facilities. All the London palaces can be reached by rail, underground and four palaces by riverboat.

Accessibility

Our palaces welcome all visitors and we try to ensure everyone's visit is successful and enjoyable. Registered disabled visitors are charged the relevant ticket price and carers are admitted free of charge.

As historical sites, our palaces do have uneven or cobbled surfaces and narrow staircases in places. Full accessibility information including wheelchair access and information on sign language tours can be found on our website hrp.org.uk.

TICKETING OPTIONS

Historic Royal Palaces have developed group friendly ticket options that allow easy access to the palaces for your customers and simplified payment terms for volume Travel Trade suppliers.

Online Group Ticketing

Groups Organisers, coach and tour operators can book their tickets for the Tower of London, Hampton Court Palace, Kensington Palace and Hillsborough Castle and Gardens via our website hrp.org.uk/travel-trade. Group rates apply to orders for 15 tickets or more, payment by credit card is required at time of booking. Tickets are sent with the confimation email. Tickets must be printed and distributed to the group members in advance of arriving at the gate.

Agency Voucher Scheme and B2B portal

Members of the Historic Royal Palaces Agency Voucher Scheme must pre-book customers through the B2B portal. With a secure login, bookings can be made 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for the Tower of London, Hampton Court Palace, Kensington Palace and Hillsborough Castle and Gardens.

All palaces operate on a timed admission basis, so you must reserve a date and time slot in advance. Details of opening and closing times and time slots are detailed on the palace pages in this guide.

Once booked, tickets are sent with your confirmation email. For six or less visitors, tickets can be presented on a mobile device, for more than six visitors, tickets must be printed and distributed to group members prior to arriving at the gate.

All tickets are scanned at the point of entry, avoiding queuing to exchange vouchers for palace tickets and allowing more time for customers to enjoy the palaces.

Agency Voucher Scheme members can cancel bookings via the B2B portal portal up to the day of arrival. To ammend a booking, please email B2BSales@hrp.org.uk no later than one week before the planned visit date.

The Royal Pass gives the traveller entry to the Tower of London, Hampton Court Palace and Kensington Palace.

This pass is exclusive to group organisers and Travel Trade clients and cannot be purchased at the palaces directly.



TOWER OF LONDON

This iconic UNESCO World Heritage Site has almost 1000 years of intriguing tales to tell. Meet the Yeoman Warders, marvel at the fabulous finery of the Crown Jewels and discover an unrivalled collection of royal arms and armour in the ancient White Tower.

Explore all the roles this impressive fortress has had to play throughout the centuries – from medieval palace, armoury, to infamous prison and execution site.







Crown Jewels

The breath-taking world famous collection of fabulous finery and regalia – discover the gloriously ornate, intricately made Crown Jewels and learn how they have inspired acts of greed, violence and even spawned stories of evil curses.







White Tower

The White Tower is an enduring icon of the London skyline, albeit nowadays dwarfed by, and in contrast to, the modern city. This striking historic building dating back to 1075 today houses the Line of Kings exhibit, a display of royal armour, life-sized wooden horses and figures of kings throughout the centuries.







Medieval Palace



Gold and Glory: Henry VIII and the French King

From 20 May – 5 September 2021 Discover the story behind the Grand European Summit between Henry VIII and François I in 1520, known as the Field of Cloth of Gold. Meet the organisers, courtiers and kings, and explore dazzling treasures from the Tudor and French courts including gold, weaponry and spectacular artworks from the Royal Collection.





Henry VIII's Kitchens

Experience the Tudor Kitchens, the well-oiled machine that powered Henry VIII's magnificent court. Immerse yourself in a bygone era with grand displays of food, authentic smells, the heat of the fireplaces, and the sounds of the busy kitchen staff.



King William III State Apartments

A grand and lavishly laid out collection of State Apartments built by the new monarchs, William and Mary. Walk through the rooms of this elegant palace and imagine the beautifully dressed courtiers revelling in the politics and gossip of court life. Gaze out of the windows to the magnificent King's Privy Garden.







Henry VIII's Apartments

Walk in the footsteps of England's most famous King and his six wives. Lavishly presented apartments include Henry's Great Hall, the Great Watching Chamber and the processional route, allegedly haunted by Catherine Howard, Henry's fifth wife.









Queen's Apartments

Climb the Queen's Staircase to discover the impressively decorated grand State Apartments originally built for Queen Mary II, redecorated by Queen Anne and occupied by George II and Queen Caroline, the last monarchs to live at Hampton Court Palace.





The Maze

Commissioned around 1700 by William III, this large and complex maze is one of the oldest surviving hedge mazes in the country and covers a third of an acre - make sure your groups have their wits about them if they choose to brave the maze!



The Great Vine

Planted by Lancelot Capability Brown in 1768, this is the oldest vine in the world. See the many bunches of grapes develop through the summer ready for harvest in late August, early September.









Tulip Festival

Returning in 2022

In spring 2021, Hampton Court Palace will become a kaleidoscope of colours as thousands of tulips bloom throughout the gardens and the courtyards. A special trail will guide visitors around the stunning displays, revealing the history of the tulips, believed to date back to Mary II (1662-1694). Our expert gardening team will also be on hand to provide tips and information to keen gardeners during their visit. Included in admission.









The Privy Garden is one of the most accurately reconstructed gardens at Hampton Court because so much was recorded about the original 1702 garden. The beautiful geometry of the garden seen against the stunning palace façade is a site not to be missed.









Georgian Kitchen Garden

See how the fruit, flowers and vegetables were planted, tended and harvested for the kings table in the 18th century in this enormous garden, full of produce.





KENSINGTON PALACE

A palace of secret stories and public lives, Kensington Palace, situated in beautiful parkland in the centre of London, was designed as a royal residence for William III & Mary II by Sir Christopher Wren. More recently, it has been the official residence of Princess Margaret, Diana Princess of Wales, and is currently home to the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge and their family. 

KEW PALACE

THE ROYAL KITCHENS, QUEEN CHARLOTTE'S COTTAGE AND THE GREAT PAGODA

Explore the royal landscape at Kew. The intimate palace brings to life the joys and sorrows of George III and his family. Discover the eating habits of the royal household in the Royal Kitchens and where they enjoyed family outings and tea at Queen Charlotte's Cottage. Lastly the Great Pagoda, designed by William Chambers for the royal family in the 18th century, the 163ft tall building was so exotic that a suspicious public were unconvinced it would remain standing.

Enter the intimate world of 18th century royalty. Over three floors, meet George III and his family in the very rooms they inhabited. Explore the Queen's Boudoir where Queen Charlotte would spend hours at needlework, spinning and knotting. Learn what some guests had to say about the King's hospitality in The King's Dining Room and discover Princess Elizabeth and Queen Charlotte's bedrooms.











Situated in an adjacent building, so as not to pollute the palace with cooking smells, discover the ingredients and methods used to prepare food for the royal table. Stroll through the kitchen garden where the produce is still grown using the Georgian methods.

Queen Charlotte's cottage

Situated in Kew Gardens, and open at weekends in the summer months, this is where the royal family enjoyed picnics and tea parties during long summer walks through the gardens. Built as a country retreat, and not a residence this is a perfect example of historic royals at play, and relaxing behind closed doors.









The Great Pagoda at Kew

The Great Pagoda, recently restored to its 18th century grandeur, is open to those brave enough to take its 253 steps to the top! As you climb, learn why the Pagoda was built and how the royal family used this unique building in the 18th century. Enjoy spectacular views of modern London and look out for the 80 specially designed rooftop dragons. An additional ticket is required to climb to the top. Opening subject to government guidelines.







George: The Mind Behind the Myth

From4 June - 26 September 2021 2020 marked 200 years since the death of George III. George grew up at Kew Palace, but later in his life, it became a place of incarceration and torment during his periods of mental illness. Through objects and interpretation in the palace rooms, explore George III's illness, treatment and public attitudes to how we think and talk about mental illness today.
