

Creating your Superbloom Garden

- **1. Pick your plot:** The Superbloom seeds will grow best in open, sunny sites that are not overshadowed by buildings or large trees. They could be sown in the soil or in pots and window boxes.
- 2. Choose your seeds: Use this guide to help you decide which seeds you would like to sow. Use them all for a large display or choose your favourites. You could design your Superbloom on a theme such as colour or the different types of pollinators the flowers will attract.
- 3. Get sowing: March to April is the best time to sow your seeds.

Atriplex hortensis 'Rubra' Colour of flower Deep red-purple 1 – 1.5m Full Sun

Leaves up to 15cm in length with tall racimes of flowers



Pot Marigold

Latin name	Calendula officinalis 'Indian Prince'
Colour of flower	Orange
Height	60 – 75cm
Position	Sun or partial shade
Description	Daisy style flowers



Corn Marigold

Latin name	Chrysanthemum segtum 'Eastern Star'
Colour of flower	Yellow
Height	50cm – 1m
Position	Full Sun
Description	Bright yellow daisy-like flowerheads



Tickseed

Latin name	Coreopsis tinctoria
Colour of flower	Gold
Height	50cm – 1m
Position	Full Sun
Description	Daisy-like bright yellow flowerheads with red centres



Viper's Bugloss

Latin name	Echium vulgare 'Blue Bedder'
Colour of flower	Blue
Height	50cm – 1m
Position	Full Sun
Description	Short spikes of violet-bl flowers and pink buds



Californian Poppy

Latin name	Eschscholtzia californica 'Single Mixed'
Colour of flower	Orange
Height	30cm
Position	Full Sun
Description	Blue-green leaves and orange flowers
